
The CF "East SOS" was established in 2014




Since February 24, 2022, CF "East SOS" has been providing assistance across all government-controlled territories of Ukraine.

















TARGETED AND CENTRALIZED EVACUATION FROM FRONTLINE AREAS

EAST SUS

Teams rescue people with disabilities, families with children, elderly individuals, and those evacuating with pets.





We have evacuated over 89,000 people from frontline areas, including more than 13,000 people with limited mobility.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE

The team responds systematically to emergency situations.

Since June 2023, we have met evacuees from temporarily occupied territories at the only checkpoint near the russian border in Sumy region.





We also respond to emergencies such as the destruction of the Kakhovka HPP by russian forces.

EMERGENCY RESPONSE

Since 2024, we've been providing comprehensive support – legal, psychological, and logistical – at transit points in Pavlohrad and Kharkiv.

Over 21,000 evacuees from Donetsk region and more than 12,000 from Kharkiv region have been registered.





We visit sites affected by shelling and provide psychosocial and legal assistance to residents in Zaporizhzhia, Kharkiv, Mykolaiv, Dnipro, and Pavlohrad.

CHARITABLE ASSISTANCE

- Distribution of food and hygiene kits to communities, Points of Invincibility, and local volunteer centers
- Support for shelters and compact settlements (appliances, furniture, repairs)
- Supplying hospitals with medical equipment and generators
- Delivery of building materials for reconstruction in de-occupied areas










SUPPORT FOR THE STATE EMERGENCY SERVICE (SES)

We support and supply SES units in Luhansk, Donetsk, Kherson, Kharkiv, Dnipropetrovsk, Mykolaiv, and Zhytomyr regions.

We have already delivered: motor pumps, ATVs, hazmat suits, motor boats, boots and overalls, helmets, body armor, debris removal backpacks, dosimeters, night vision devices, demining boots, trailers, electronic warfare (EW) systems, drone detection systems, shelter equipment and more.







CALL CENTER

The call center has been operating for over 11 years.

We process evacuation and relocation requests, war crime documentation, mobile team deployment, legal aid, and useful info for IDPs.

PSYCHOLOGICAL SUPPORT

We implement projects supporting civilian mental health, including:

- mobile team consultations in frontline areas,
- webinars and support groups,
- crisis counseling,
- art therapy for children and adults.









NATIONWIDE NETWORK "ZATYSHNO SPACE"

Cherkasy, Kropyvnytskyi, Vinnytsia, Zaporizhzhia, Mykolaiv, Kharkiv.

These cities host "Zatyshno space" psychosocial and legal support hubs.

Over 2 years more than 14,000 adults and 3,470 children have used free services.











EDUCATION INITIATIVES

- Psychosocial and educational support for children
- Professional development for educators
- Oapacity-building for NGOs and activists
- Shelter, safety, and psychological classroom renovations
- Monitoring visits to frontline and de-occupied regions
- Annual "Opinion Festival"
- Advocacy for simplified admission to higher and vocational education for youth from TOT









In 2024, we piloted the "Easy Camp" full-day support program for 150 youth from temporarily occupied and frontline areas of Zaporizhzhia region in Zakarpattia.

WAR CRIME DOCUMENTATION

We collect testimonies from survivors of russian war crimes against Ukrainians to submit to international courts.

APPROXIMATELY 1,560 STORIES DOCUMENTED

We publish materials in collaboration with media such as Svidomi, Nova Ukrainian School, Svoi, Gazeta UA, War: Stories from Ukraine, Babel, ZMINA.UA, War Stories in Ukraine.







WAR CRIME DOCUMENTATION

In 2025, the CF "East SOS" released the report "Invisible People" of Ukraine's Frontline Territories – covering crimes against the humanitarian sector.

We also research and document war crimes against Ukraine's education system, war crimes against Ukrainian children.





LEGAL SUPPORT

In 2024, we merged our legal and advocacy sectors into a single human rights department. This integration combined fieldwork with advocacy initiatives.

We provide free legal aid on housing, land, property, social, pension, and labor rights. We help restore lost documents and obtain compensation for damaged or destroyed property.







Over 1,300 private homes repaired in Kharkiv and Donetsk regions damaged by russian attacks.








REPAIRS FOR TEMPORARY AND GERIATRIC CENTERS

12 facilities equipped in Ivano-Frankivsk, Poltava, and Kharkiv regions

Over 650 accommodation spots created for people with disabilities in shelters and geriatric centers in Ivano-Frankivsk region (Blyudnyky, Lysets, Kalush, Sniatyn, Kolondiany), Cherkasy (Uman), Vinnytsia (Plyskiv), Zakarpattia (Neresnytsia).















- We are renovating centers in Poltava and Lviv regions:
 - Drilling wells for clean water access,
 - Installing solar panels,
 - Rebuilding FAPs and hospitals.

In Stetseva (Ivano-Frankivsk): shelter for 30 elderly people from frontline areas

In Kolyndiany (Ternopil): permanent shelter for 80 people who lost their homes

WINTER PREPAREDNESS

Our team supplies "Points of Invincibility," educational institutions, and medical and obstetrical stations with generators, Starlinks, heaters, cast-iron stoves, and water heaters.

In the winter of 2022, we responded to a request from Ukrzaliznytsia by equipping


10 warm banks at railway stations.

We provide frontline communities with heating materials.










Additionally, we equipped about 20 "Points of Invincibility" in Kharkiv, Donetsk, Zaporizhzhia, Dnipropetrovsk, and Sumy Oblasts.

OPINION FESTIVAL

An annual gathering of thoughtful Ukrainians for open dialogue, discussion, and exchange with invited speakers initiated in partnership with the Estonian organization Mondo.



Launched in 2017 in the Luhansk region, the festival was originally held in eastern Ukraine. In 2022, due to the war, the location shifted to Dnipro. The 2023 edition took place at the National Museum of the History of Ukraine in the Second World War, beside the iconic Motherland Monument. In 2024, the event united participants in the heart of Kyiv, on the historic grounds of the National Conservation Area "Sophia of Kyiv."

FRONTLINE & DE-OCCUPIED AREA MONITORING

Since 2014, the CF "East SOS" has conducted international monitoring missions in frontline settlements. Findings inform national and international advocacy.







MONITORING TEMPORARY HOUSING FACILITIES

We regularly monitor and renovate temporary housing for IDPs. In 2025, our team visited facilities in Poltava, Kharkiv, Mykolaiv, Kherson, Dnipropetrovsk, Chernihiv, Sumy, Vinnytsia, Cherkasy, Kirovohrad, Rivne, Volyn, Ternopil, Ivano-Frankivsk


